Isabelle was born in Scotland in 1850. When she was five years old, she left Scotland with her parents and family for America, crossing the Plains in 1855. They settled in Bear River by Franklin, Idaho.

When she was seventeen, she married William Clark Davis as his second wife, November 8, 1867. Their first son, Thomas, was born while they lived in Riverdale, Oneida County, Idaho.

Her daughter, Mary, was born in 1870, in Hooper, Utah. Isabelle divorced William and lived with her parents in Hooper.

Isabelle married Jonathan Smith, as his second wife, 1872, in Salt Lake City. They were the parents of seven children. She moved into a home in Harrisville by his family. The first child, Jonathan, was born in

1873, but died a few months later. Her son, Thomas, from her first marriage, died a few months later, in 1874. In the fall of 1879 diphtheria spread through Harrisville and three more of Isabelle's children died, Mary, Eliza Ann, and Jesse; leaving only Arvilla.

Isabelle had a son Robert, in 1880. The following fall Jonathan moved his families to Weston, Idaho. Polly was born on October 25, 1883 and Adelia was born October 3, 1884. In 1888, Jonathan was in the Penitentiary for five months for polygamy.

On November 27, 1897, Isabelle's daughter, Polly died. Isabelle's husband, Jonathan, passed away on July 15, 1899. She moved to Shelley, Idaho with her daughter, Arvilla. Isabelle passed away on January 3], 1920 in Shelly, Idaho, at the age of seventy
